## Chicago teacher joins Climate Change Research Team



On February 27, 2009, Megan Ellis, a Kindergarten and first grade teacher at The Academy for Global Citizenship on the southwest side of Chicago, started her class from an unusual location, Churchill, Manitoba, the edge of the Arctic Circle. Mrs. Ellis will use satellite and Internet technology to connect "Live from the Field" to her classroom and community. She will join Earthwatch Institute's Climate Change at the Arctic's Edge expedition as a member of a research team consisting of scientists and volunteers determined to collect data and answer issues related to climate change.

Mrs. Ellis is looking forward to bringing all that she has learned back into her classroom. "I love to travel and learn new things. My goal is for my students to be excited to go out into the world and find answers to their own burning questions. The students are excited about this expedition and have learned a lot about the Arctic to prepare," says Mrs. Ellis.
